ST. PAUL'S HOSPITAL AND FOUNDATION HEALING CENTER ART CALL OUT

St. Paul's Hospital & Foundation is seeking Indigenous artists from across Saskatchewan to design artwork for St. Paul's Hospital Indigenous Healing Center, which will soon be named through ceremony in Saskatoon. The project team aims to:

- 1. Honour Indigenous culture, knowledge and stories through art within the Healing Centre;
- 2. Reflect the Seven Sacred Teachings: Respect, Love, Courage, Honesty, Wisdom, Humility, and Truth; and,
- 3. Create a welcoming and inclusive space for health seeking relatives at St. Paul's Hospital.

The new St. Paul's Hospital entrance includes an Indigenous Healing Centre equipped with an art rail system. As the first phase of a rotational art program, SPH&F is seeking Saskatchewan Indigenous artists to create art reflecting the Seven Sacred Teachings.

The selected artist will be welcomed to present the art through teachings and ceremony upon completion. Each piece of art is anticipated to be in place for no less than three (3) years, and rights to each piece will remain with SPH, who may choose to display the piece in other locations, return the art to the artist or coordinate the transition of the piece with the artist to a third party.

OPPORTUNITY

Who can apply:

- Indigenous artist from across Saskatchewan;
- Métis and the eight First Nation linguistic communities;
- Individual artists or collectives;
- Artist may submit one or multiple pieces.

SELECTION CRITERIA

The artist will be selected by a panel including representatives from MNS, SK Elders, SPH&F. The panel will review the submissions and select the artist or artists. The artist/s will then be notified and scheduled to meet with the team to discuss the artwork.

Criteria

- Aesthetic qualities;
- Depth of connection to traditional Indigenous teachings;
- Artistic skills based on samples provided.

Submission opens: December 5, 2025
Application deadline: January 21, 2026
Committee selection: February 20, 2026
Notification to artist: March 6, 2026

Delivery of art: May 6, 2026
